Anyone 18 and older can register to be a donor online as well as through their state Dpt. of Motor Vehicle Office (driver's license/state ID). Teens 16/17 can register when applying for driver's license.

Anyone can register regardless of upper age or medical history. It's only determined at the time of a person's death if they can donate their organs and tissue to help others, so anyone can register today.

If someone would like to register to be a donor they can do so right on their smartphone if they have one, by typing in the web address, [www.RegisterMe.org](http://www.RegisterMe.org). **This is the easiest way to register!** Some volunteers use their own smart phones to register people.

**Apple iPhone** users can also register through the Health app on their phone, click on Medical ID in the app to register. Or, just ask Siri to help you register 😊

**Snapchat** users can hover over our Snap chat image and that will bring them to [RegisterMe.org](http://RegisterMe.org) to register.

You may use your own laptop, smart phone or iPad at events for people to register to be a donor. This is optional.

People can sign up online on their computers 24/7 and each time they renew their driver's license or state ID.

People signing up online will receive one email confirmation from our office they have registered.

People are not put on a mailing list when they register to be a donor.

The donor indication (heart) is only put on the driver's license when the person signs up through their motor vehicle office.

People signing up through their motor vehicle office must sign up each time to stay on the Donor Registry.

People can add or take themselves off the Donor Registry anytime by going to [www.registerme.org](http://www.registerme.org) or by going to their state's motor vehicle website.

If someone had trouble registering online you can direct them to their state's motor vehicle office online and be sure they verbally share their decision with family.

**Although signing up to be a donor is a person's legal consent we encourage people to share their decision with family.**

After someone registers please thank them and remind them to sign up each time they renew their driver's license or state ID and share their decision with their families.

Registering to be a donor online or through DMV means you are signing up to be a donor at the time of your death. If someone is interesting in be a LIVING donor they should talk with their local transplant program.
