



Donor Registry Facts

Why register your decision to be a donor?

By registering your decision to be an organ and tissue donor in the National Donate Life Registry, you are helping to save lives and give hope to the 113,000 people in the United States currently waiting for lifesaving organ transplants. Thousands more people are in need of tissue or corneal transplants to restore health. One donor can save and heal more than 75 lives.

95% of Americans support donation, but only 60% are registered, help bridge the gap!

The National Donate Life Registry:

To register online: RegisterMe.org (direct link, not case sensitive)

People can register to be a donor online as well as through their state Motor Vehicle Office (driver's license/state ID).

People of all ages and medical histories should consider themselves potential donors. A person's medical condition at the time of death will determine what organs and tissues can be donated.

Apple iPhone users can also register through the Health app on their phone, click on Medical ID in the app to register.

Optional: You may use your own laptop, smart phone, tablet or iPad at events for people to register to be a donor.

People can sign up online. Also, continue to check the YES box when renewing driver's license or state ID.

The donor indication (heart) is only put on the driver's license when the person signs up through their motor vehicle office (driver's license).

People can add or take themselves off the Donor Registry by going to RegisterMe.org and click on "Edit Registration". Go to state motor vehicle office website if registered through driver's license or state ID.

If someone has trouble registering online at RegisterMe.org they can register when renewing their driver's license or state ID, and verbally share their decision with family.

Signing up to be a donor is our legal consent (when 18 and older), however, it's always helpful to share or decision with family and friends.
